Ms. Chris, as she is known to her students, has taught Isshinryu Karate since 1992. Chris is currently a 5th degree Black Belt in Isshinryu. Prior to opening her own dojo, she taught at many notable Isshinryu schools and attended numerous teaching and instructional seminars through the National Association of Martial Artist. She has been certified by the Cooper's Institute for her teaching skills.

Chris co-owns Family Self
Defense Center with her
husband "Mr. Z" Szelap, a 6th
degree Isshinryu Black Belt
Master. She invented the first
ever Isshinryu History Board
Game: "Vertical Punch", which
is used as a study tool for her
students.

In 1999 the National Isshinryu Hall of Fame Board chose Ms. Chris as one of the top 5 Female Instructors Nationally. In 2003 she was voted the Top Contributor to Isshinryu Karate, and received the same Contribution honor again in 2009, this time paired with her husband. In 2010 Ms. Chris was voted the Top Female Instructor in the Nation by the Isshinryu Hall of Fame and received Top Five honors in 2011. Her dojo was also chosen Tops in the Nation for their Contribution to Isshinrvu in 2011. Chris has also earned National awards for her performance of empty hand and weapon katas.

Chris currently devotes her life to Isshinryu, teaching 6 days a week with her husband. She also attends local and national tournaments with her students, and participates, with her students, in countless community projects and demonstrations.

She received a BA degree from the University of Michigan, in Ann Arbor, in Child Psychology. She has three grown children who all were Isshinryu practitioners. Her oldest son was the first ever Jr. Black Belt for FSDC.
